


Acorn Homework - Spring

Mrs Duckett's Bucket List

- ★ Communication and language - During spring, seeds begin to grow. In the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, Jack's beans grow into a magic bean stalk! Tell the story of Jack and the Beanstalk at home. You could even act out the story together!
- ★ Physical development - Help an adult to make a healthy meal. Can you draw the meal? How do you know that it is healthy?
- ★ Personal, social and emotional development - Show that you can take turns, listen and respect other people's opinions and ideas. You could play a board game with your family.
- ★ Literacy - Draw your favourite animal or character. Write some words to describe them or facts about them.
- ★ Mathematics - Go on a walk to collect natural resources such as twigs, stones, leaves, flowers, gravel, conkers and acorns. How will you sort out this mixture of objects? Tell your adult why you've sorted



them like this. What do these items have in common? How are they different? How many of each object are there? Can you make a tally chart to record this? Can you create a block graph to organise and show the information?

- ★ *Understanding the world* - During spring, lots of animals have their babies. Find out the names of these baby animals: duck, pig, sheep, cow and horse. How did you find the information?
- ★ *Make a weather chart* to show what the weather is like. You could draw a picture of the weather each day. Do you think weather is the same in winter and summer? How is it different? Which is your favourite? Why?
- ★ *Expressive arts and design* - Create a picture of a flower. Remember to draw some petals, a stem and leaves. Find out which flower you have drawn (e.g. a rose or daisy) - how did you find out this information?
- ★ *Go for a walk with a grown up* and look for signs of spring. Think of a way to show everyone what you saw. You could draw, paint or collage a picture. You could show a photograph you took. You could even make up a dance about spring!
